The Representative Sports Grant category is now a tiered funding structure, up to a maximum cap of \$1,000 (ex GST) as per below, or 50% of competition costs, whichever is lesser. This grant is designed to support individuals excelling at sport and representing Parramatta at a State, National or International level.

Applicants must apply at least four weeks before the sporting event start date. The assessment and approval process can take longer than four weeks resulting in applicants being notified of a funding decision after the event has occurred. All successful grant recipients are required to submit proof of competition attendance as part of the acquittal process. Recipients must acquit the application within four weeks of the competition.
